Population by Ethnicity

Ethnic population totals are taken from the 2011 Census which was released in December 2012.

This provides a count of the number of people by ethnicity as at the time of the 2011 Census (27th March 2011)

The 2001 Census used 16 categories of ethnic group, which were then grouped into five broad categories. The more recent 2011 Census used 18 categories of ethnic group but which are also grouped into five broad categories. The two new categories are 'Gypsy or Irish Traveller' and 'Arab'.

Length of Residence in the UK

The length of residence in the UK is derived from the date that a person last arrived to live in the UK. Short visits away from the UK are not counted in determining the date that a person last arrived.

Length of residence is only applicable to usual residents who were not born in the UK. It does not include usual residents born in the UK who have emigrated and since returned - these are recorded in the category 'Born in the UK'.
